Information and Instructions to Candidates

*Common application to seek admission to Government and Government Aided Engineering Colleges, Anna University- University Departments and Constituent Colleges of Anna University, Annamalai University and for the seats surrendered by Self-Financing Engineering Colleges in Tamil Nadu under Unified Single Window Admission System for **Indian Nationals**.*

1. ALLOCATION OF SEATS IN COLLEGES

a) Category I

Seats in B. E. & B. Tech. Degree Courses in Government, Government Aided Anna University - University Departments and Constituent Colleges of Anna University, Annamalai University

- (i) **Seats in Government Engineering Colleges.**
- (ii) **Seats in Aided courses in Government Aided Engineering Colleges.**

(a) Seats in B. E. & B. Tech. Degree Courses in Anna University, University Departments and Constituent Colleges of Anna University.

(b) Seats in B. E. Degree Courses in Mechanical Engineering and Civil Engineering (Tamil Medium) in University Departments and Constituent Colleges of Anna University.

b) Category II

- (i) **Seats in Self-Supporting courses in Government Aided Engineering colleges**
- (ii) **Seats surrendered by Self Financing Engineering Colleges.**
- (iii) **Seats in Central Institute of Plastic Engineering and Technology (CIPET).**

A candidate needs to register **only one online application** for all the courses/colleges/Institutions mentioned above irrespective of the category. Candidates seeking admission under special reservation should also give their option for Special Reservation category along with the main online application. The special reservation categories instructions are available in the section 4.2.

2. DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME

3. ELIGIBILITY RULES GENERAL

Candidates satisfying the eligibility conditions given below as on the last date of submission of online application are eligible to apply. Passing the qualifying examination after the last date of submission of online application shall not be considered.

4. NATIVITY

- i) Tamil Nadu candidates who have passed IX, X Std, and Diploma / XI, XII Std and B.Sc from schools / colleges situated in Tamil Nadu are eligible to apply. They need not produce Nativity Certificate for verification.
- ii) Tamil Nadu native candidates who have passed any of the IX, X Std and Diploma / XI XII Std and B.Sc from schools / colleges situated outside Tamil Nadu can also apply. They should produce **Original Nativity Certificate only in electronic form/digitally signed e- Certificate** at the time of certificates verification.
- iii) Children of Central Government Employees may also apply for admission, irrespective of their native, provided their parents or guardians (only if both parents are not alive) have been serving in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past **FIVE YEARS** at the time of submission of application. This should be supported by producing a certificate from the employer of the parent or guardian, to that effect at the time of original certificates verification.
- iv) Children of employees in Public Sector or Government recognized Institutions who at the time of submission of application for admission employed in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past five years may also apply irrespective of their domicile. A certificate from the employer stating that the person is a Permanent Employee of the Firm or Institution concerned with evidence like Income Tax return, PF Slips, etc. and is working in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past **FIVE YEARS** has to be produced at the time of original certificates verification.
- v) Sons and daughters of All India service Tamil Nadu cadre officers are eligible to apply. A Self declaration from the parent in this regard is to be produced at the time of original certificates verification.
- vi) Other State candidates who have studied IX, X Std and Diploma / XI , XII Std and B.Sc. in Tamil Nadu are eligible to apply. They need not produce "Nativity Certificate".

Note:

1. Applications without proper Nativity Certificate for Category (ii) without proper employer certificate for categories (iii) and (iv) and without self declaration from the parent for category(v) will not be considered.
2. Category (vi) need not produce employer certificate / nativity certificate.
3. Categories from (iii) to (vi) will be considered under "Open Competition".

Srilankan Tamil Refugee

As per G.O. (Ms) No. 143, Higher Education (J2) Department, dated : 14-6- 2011 and G.O. (Ms) No.159, Higher Education (J2) Department, dated : 4-7- 2011, candidates who are Srilankan Tamil Refugee studied in Tamil Nadu will be considered under open competition.

They have to produce the following at the time of original certificates verification:

- (i) Identification certificate from the Head Quarters Tahsildar.
- (ii) Those who have not registered in the refugee camp should produce original passport, visa and letter registered with Police Station.

- When the candidates produce grade certificates, they have to produce the actual marks also otherwise only the minimum marks applicable to the grades will be taken into account.
- For minimum eligibility rounding of marks and normalized marks will not be considered.

4.1 ALLOCATION OF SEATS

Selection shall be made under Seven categories namely OC, BC, BC Muslim candidates, MBC & DNC SC, SCA and ST following the rule of reservation of Government of Tamil Nadu as follows.

4.1 (a) Tamil Nadu native candidates alone will be considered for communal reservation. The community recorded in the certificate of Tamil Nadu native candidate should appear in the list of communities approved by the Government of Tamil Nadu.

4.1 (b) The applicants from Tamil Nadu State should have obtained permanent community certificate (for SC/SCA/ST/MBC & DNC, BC and BC Muslim candidates) **in permanent card format / electronic form / digitally signed e-Certificate** only from the authorities given below on or before the last date prescribed for submission of online application. Community Certificate obtained after the last date prescribed for submission of online applications will not be considered.

4.1 (c) Community Certificate obtained from **other states** will not be considered for communal reservation.

4.1 (d) For communities linked with Districts the candidates should obtain their community certificate in the respective district except the communities mentioned in G.O. (st) No. 95 BC, MBC & Minorities Welfare Department dt: 28.10.2009. Such of those community certificates obtained on or after 28.10.2009 will be considered. Community certificate obtained from other than the respective district will not be considered.

4.1 (e) Candidates who have not produced the Community Certificate in the form of Permanent Community [Card] Certificate or electronic form/ Digitally signed e- Certificate at the time of original certificates verification, their application will be treated under "Open Competition (OC)".

The candidate is further informed that in the event of such a decision, the eligibility conditions & rules prescribed for OC will be applicable for such candidates and if such candidates do not satisfy the rules of OC, their applications are liable to be rejected. No correspondence in this connection will be entertained.

4.1 (f) SC/SCA/ST/MBC & DNC, BC and BC Muslim candidates are eligible for selection under Open Competition in addition to the reservation made for them.

4.2 SPECIAL RESERVATION

Special Categories

The special reservation categories and the quota for these categories are given in the Table. Candidates are instructed to produce appropriate certificates and supporting documents for special reservation claim at the time of Original Certificates Verification. If appropriate certificates and documents are not produced, their claim under such categories will not be considered.

Only Tamil Nadu Native candidates are eligible for Special reservation.

Note :

(i) Candidates seeking admission against reservation [Item No. 1] set apart for Orthopaedically Differently Abled Persons/Hearing Impaired (Deaf) / Visually Impaired should produce the certificate from the Medical Board of the District concerned certifying the nature and **extent of disability in percentage** and with regard to his / her suitability for admission to Engineering Colleges specifically mentioned below and in the Format given in this application (Certificate No. IV / V / VI/VII/VIII) respectively. **Certificates obtained from an individual Doctor will not be considered. Further, a separate Board for each category will examine the candidates with reference to their certificates before counselling.**

(ii) Selection for Sl. No. 2 Eminent Sports Persons will be based on the total marks obtained for achievements in Sports.

(iii) Candidates claiming admission against reservation under [Item No. 3] should enclose the certificate as per format in Certificate No. IV. In addition, they should also enclose a copy of the Jail Extracts or in its absence, Co-prisoner's Certificate or certificate from Ex-Chief Minister or Ex-Minister or Ex-member of Legislature or Ex-member of Parliament as evidence that the Parent of the candidate is a Freedom Fighter suffered imprisonment for a period not less than one month subject to verification wherever it is found necessary.

(iv) Candidates claiming admission against the reservation of seats under [Item No. 4] should enclose the certificate in the format appended to the application form (Certificate No. III) from an officer of the Department of Ex-servicemen's Welfare of Tamilnadu not below the rank of Assistant Director of Ex- servicemen's Welfare of the district of which the dependent is a native. Candidates called for counselling should produce discharge certificates and ExServicemen ID cards of their parents.

Candidates seeking selection against the seats under the Special Reservations [Item No. 4] should also satisfy the eligibility rules mentioned in Item No. 4.2 of the Information and Instructions to Candidates. The candidates are also eligible for admission under general counselling.

Eligibility Criteria for Various Disabilities

A. Norms for Visual Impairment

Candidates with low vision of 40 % and above are considered as disabled, and hence eligible for claiming Engineering Admission against Differently Abled Persons category (Certificate No. IV).

1. **"Blindness"** means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction—
 - (i) total absence of sight; or
 - (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or

(ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.

2. "**Low-vision**" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:—

(i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 up to 3/60 or up to 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with bestpossible corrections; or

(ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

Person with impairment of vision of less than 6/18 to 6/60 with best correction in the better eye or impairment of field in any one of the following categories:

(a) Reduction of fields less than 50 degrees, (b) Heminaopia with macular involvement, and (c) Attitudinal defect involving lower fields categories of Visual Disability all with correction.

B. Norms for Hearing Impairment

Candidates with hearing ability of 40 db and above only in the better ear with speech discrimination score of 50 % and above are considered disabled and hence eligible for claiming Engineering Admissions against Differently Abled Persons category (Certificate No. V).

1. "**Deaf**" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears.

2. "**Hard of hearing**" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears.

C. Norms for Locomotor Disability

Candidates with permanent physical impairment of 40 % and above are considered as disabled. The candidates with Locomotor disability including cerebral palsy, leprosy cured, dwarfism, acid attack victims and muscular dystrophy of the following types are eligible for claiming Engineering Admission against Differently Abled Persons category (Certificate No. VI).

1. **Locomotor disability** (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both).

(i) Independent in ambulation with **or** without calipers but without walking aids. (ii) Good Standing Balance without calipers but without any support. (iii) Hand Function with normal limit without any aid. (iv) Good control over bladder & bowel. (v) Disease must be non progressive.

2. "**Leprosy cured person**" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—

- (i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity;
- (ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
- (iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall be construed accordingly;

3. "**Cerebral palsy**" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;

4. **"Dwarfism"** means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;
5. **"Muscular dystrophy"** means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterised by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;
6. **"Acid attack victims"** means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

D. Norms for Autism, Intellectual Disability, Specific Learning Disability and Mental Illness

Candidates with permanent physical impairment of 40 % and above are considered as disabled. The candidates with Autism, Intellectual Disability, Specific Learning Disability and Mental Illness of the following types are eligible for claiming Engineering Admission against Differently Abled Persons category (Certificate No. VII).

1. **"Speech and language disability"** means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.
2. **Intellectual disability**, a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—
 - (i) "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;
 - (ii) "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.
3. **Mental behaviour** — "mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterized by sub normality of intelligence.
4. **Disability caused due to—**
 - (i) chronic neurological conditions, such as—
 - (a) "multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelization and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;
 - (b) "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.
 - (ii) Blood disorder—
 - (c) "hemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterized by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding;
 - (d) "Thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of hemoglobin.
 - (e) "sickle cell disease" means a hemolytic disorder characterized by chronic anemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "hemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of hemoglobin.

E. Norms for Multiple Disabilities

Candidates with multiple disabilities with permanent physical impairment of 40 % and above are considered as disabled and they are eligible for claiming Engineering Admission against Differently Abled Persons category (Certificate No. VIII).

Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

SELECTION OF CANDIDATES UNDER QUOTA FOR EMINENT SPORTS PERSONS

1. The purpose of this quota is to recognise and give weightage to the sports eminence of the candidates and hence marks for sports achievements alone will be considered in ranking the candidates. The candidates are expected to continue good performance in sports, even after selection.
2. The candidate may submit **all the sports certificates along with participation certificates and relevant forms**, but only one highest achievement in a tournament (among the International, National, State, Divisional and District) in a year in the sports disciplines listed in Table will be considered for awarding marks.
3. Selection of the candidate will be based on the marks obtained by the candidate following the guidelines, given in the tables.

4.(a) For International Tournaments

Category – I: Olympics, World Cup / Commonwealth Games and Asian games (Games organised in 4 years frequency by the International Olympic Committee).

Category – II: A minimum of six countries must have been participated for International tournaments which are not covered under Category I and such tournaments approved by Indian Olympics Association (IOA), Sports Authority of India (SAI) and Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS), Government of India.

Open / Invitational / Memorial / any indifferent nomenclature or title of tournaments / Championships at International level, not approved by any of the above will not be considered for marks.

1. **Participation / achievement in International tournaments will be considered only with earlier achievements at National / State level tournaments. Direct participation in any International / National tournaments will not be considered for award of marks.**
2. The highest achievement in only one annual regular tournament, officially conducted in a regular manner by the member National Olympic Committee (NOCs) authorised by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) / International Sports Federations affiliated to the IOC. The players / sports persons representing the Country in such tournaments through Indian Olympic Association (IOA) / respective National Sports Federations recognised by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India / IOA will be considered for award of marks in each year.
3. Only tournaments officially recognised by the Indian Olympic Association/ respective official National Federations will be considered for the award of marks (for each year) from **01.06.2021 to 31.05.2025 (01.06.2021 to 31.05.2022, 01.06.2022 to 31.05.2023, 01.06.2023 to 31.05.2024 and 01.06.2024 to 31.05.2025).**
4. **Certificates of Participation / Achievements in tournaments, submitted along with Form I alone are eligible for marks indicated in Table (I) above (should be submitted before the last date for submission of application).**
5. **Players who participated in any of the above I to II – Table (I) Category tournaments (organised outside India) should produce copies of VISA/Immigration entry in passport/clearance from Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (Government of India) – Indian Olympic Association – respective National Sports Federations including BCCI/fixture or draw or schedule of events/players' accreditation / National Medal-Merit – Participation – Form – I issued by respective National Sports Federation / Medal – Diploma or certificate signed and issued in the prescribed format by the President / Secretary General of the National Olympic Committee of the Organising Country and International Federation / Details of Total Number of Countries participated, etc.**

(b) For National Tournaments

1. The National tournaments should officially be recognised as the regular annual championship / tournament by Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) / Indian Olympic Association / SAI / SDAT / respective official National Sports Federation will be considered (for each year) for the award of marks.
2. Marks will not be awarded for selection trials / coaching camps.
3. Any tournaments conducted by the Federations which are derecognised by the IOA or MYAS at National level for a particular period will not be considered for award of marks.

(c) For State Tournaments

1. The State level tournaments should officially be recognised as the regular annual championship / tournament by respective official State Association / SAI / SDAT will be considered (for each year) for the award of marks.
2. Marks will not be awarded for selection trials / coaching camps.
3. Any tournaments conducted by the Association which are derecognised by the TNOA or SDAT at State level for a particular period will not be considered for award of marks.

5. General Conditions

1. For consideration of candidates seeking admission under the category of eminent sports person, he / she should enclose all the attested photocopies of participation certificates and the relevant Forms issued by the competent sports authorities the along with the application.
2. Participation / achievements in each academic year from **01.06.2021 to 31.05.2025 (01.06.2021 to 31.05.2022, 01.06.2022 to 31.05.2023, 01.06.2023 to 31.05.2024 and 01.06.2024 to 31.05.2025)** in sports / games shown in the list alone will be taken into account. National / State Level Championships or Tournaments conducted by Sports Federations / Associations recognised by Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports / Indian Olympic Association (IOA) / Sports Development Authority of Tamilnadu (SDAT) /

Tamilnadu Olympic Association (TNOA) alone will be considered for award of marks. (Recognition of State Associations / National Federations should be relevant to the year concerned).

5. Open / Invitational / Memorial / any indifferent nomenclature or title of tournaments / Championships at District / State / National / International level will not be considered for marks.
6. District / Inter-District Championship means the championships conducted by the respective recognised District / State Sports Association for a Revenue District / Revenue Districts in the State of Tamil Nadu.
7. Direct participation / achievement at any level without participating in the qualifying level competitions such as District / State / National or direct selection conducted by District / State Sports Association / National Sports Federation to represent the District / State / National / International tournaments or championships will not be considered for award of marks.
8. For International achievements in Tennis, marks for Gold / Silver / Bronze will be awarded to players who are ranked first / second / third in the ATP / WTA rankings of International Tennis Federation for awarding of participation marks for the top 5 ranked players will be considered from the ATP / WTA list published by the International Tennis Federation. Necessary document / proof should be enclosed by the candidate. For National / State level achievement in Tennis, marks for Gold / Silver / Bronze will be awarded to players who are ranked first / second / third in the AITA / TNTA at National / State respectively. For awarding of participation mark the top 5 ranked players will be considered from the list published by AITA / TNTA at National / State level based on the ranking. Necessary document / proof should be enclosed by the candidate.
9. **Certificates should be in printed form and necessary Form – I and II should be in prescribed format. (Certificates / forms issued in letter pads will be invalid).**
10. All other sport disciplines in which ranking is the criteria for assessment of achievement, rules indicated in item 8 above will be applicable for award of marks.
11. For Cricket, the annual official Championships / tournaments conducted within the country under the auspices of TNCA / BCCI at District / State / National Level alone will be taken into consideration for that year.

19. Required number of candidates will be called to appear for an interview before the Common Committee for Engineering for verification of the Originals, followed by counselling after ranking.
20. If any candidate fails to produce the requisite Original Certificates / Forms, his / her place will be allotted to the candidate next in rank and so on. The consequential vacancy at the end of the rank list will be filled up from among the additional candidates according to their ranks.
21. All the highest level of participation / achievement should be supported by earlier achievements at all levels of competition.
22. Selected candidates will be counselled and allotment of branches and colleges earmarked for the Sports Quota based on the ranking before the start of the General Counselling.
23. Candidates securing admissions under Eminent Sports Persons quota should sign an undertaking at the time of receiving allotment order assuring of participation in sports activities in the college preferred by them.
24. Legal action would be taken on parents / candidates for furnishing bogus documents under this Sports Quota. They should ensure that the certificates obtained are from competent authorities.
25. A candidate can utilise the Sports Quota only once for Engineering.

5. TUITION FEE CONCESSION

First Graduate Tuition Fee Concession

In the G.O. (st) No. 85 Higher Education (J2) Department dated: 16.04.2010, the Government has ordered to grant tuition fee concession to the candidates who are to be the first graduate in a family, those who are attending counselling and joined in professional courses in Government / Aided and Self-Financing Engineering Colleges. They have to submit the following:

Certificate obtained from Head Quarters Deputy Tahsildar in the format prescribed in G.O. **Electronic form/digitally signed e-Certificate only will be accepted** which necessarily should include name of applicant's father, mother, father's father, father's mother, mother's father,

mother's mother, brother (s) and sister (s) and joint declaration by himself and parent/guardian in the prescribed format.

If the applicant's Brother or Sister has already availed First Graduate Tuition Fee concession for studying Professional Courses, then the applicant is not eligible for such concession.

AICTE Tuition Fee Waiver (TFW) Scheme

This scheme is applicable in Self-Financing Engineering Colleges and Self-Supporting courses in Government Aided Engineering Colleges only. AICTE Tuition fee waiver scheme is applicable for B.E. / B.Tech. courses only. Seats up to a maximum of 5 percent of sanctioned intake per course may be available under the scheme. Tuition fee waiver under First Graduate scheme is provided by Government whereas, AICTE TFW scheme is provided by the Management of the Institution. Sons and daughters of parents whose annual income is less than **Rs. 6.0 lakhs** from all sources shall only be eligible under this scheme.

All other fees except tuition fee will have to be paid by the candidate. Beneficiary student admitted under AICTE TFW scheme will not be allowed to change Institution / course under any circumstances.

Post Matric Scholarship

In the G.O. (st) No. 6 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 09.01.2012, G.O. (st) No. 92 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 11.09.2012 and G.O. (st) No. 16 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 24.02.2014, the Government have ordered to grant Post Matric Scholarship to SC/SCA/ST candidates and SC/SCA converted Christians, whose parental annual income is less than Rs. 2,50,000/- from all the sources shall only be eligible. The eligible candidates have to submit income certificate obtained from appropriate authorities and get the Post Matric Scholarship from the colleges where they get admitted.
